Please find below this week's Sussex Alerts from Eastbourne Police.

Burglar charged



Off-duty PCSO helps catch wanted burglary suspect in Langney Point.

An eagle-eyed off-duty PCSO spotted a man acting suspiciously around homes in the Langney Point area last week.

Officers quickly responded and found the man hiding behind a property in Beatty Road. He was arrested and taken into custody – and later found to be wanted for a number of offences including burglary.

The 25 year old man, of St Leonards-on-Sea, was remanded and appeared at Brighton Magistrates' Court the following day (4 October) and was released on strict bail conditions.

He's due back in court on 24 November for sentencing on a number of offences, including burglary.

Remand for prolific shoplifter

A shoplifter who targeted stores around the town, including shops around The Crumbles retail park over the last few months, and breached a criminal behaviour order (CBO) issued earlier this year has been remanded.



A 32 year old female, of Stockleigh Road, St Leonards on Sea, was charged this week at Brighton and Hove Magistrates' Court for six breaches of her CBO and six reports of theft, where she was remanded in custody for sentencing.

If you feel unsafe

- Don't open your door if you're unsure who is there. Use your spyhole, look out of a window, and use your door chain if you do decide to open your door.
- Have a contact number of a close relative or good neighbour to hand by your telephone, just in case you need to phone them.
- If you are part of a Neighbourhood Watch scheme, let your coordinator know that you will be on your own at Hallowe'en. If you are a coordinator, please identity people in your scheme that may be vulnerable and offer them reassurance.
- If you are driving on the evening of the 31st, remember that excited children may be crossing the road unexpectedly, so slow down in residential areas and take extra care.
