Safeguarding future generations

In recent weeks, aiming to raise awareness, build resilience, and share vital information to help keep students and their friends safe, we've spent time with Year 9 at St Leonards Academy during Personal Development lessons, discussing knives, knife crime, and County Lines issues.

We covered the consequences and laws around knives and offensive weapons, including what



counts as reasonable excuse and lawful authority. This included some lively, well-received role play. We also explored why someone might carry a knife and their motivations.

On County Lines, we looked at how criminal gangs groom and exploit vulnerable young people and adults, such as through 'cuckooing', using violence, coercion, and false narratives to glamourise such activity. We talked about the serious risks for young people involved, how ruthless gangs can be, and

the wider impact on parents, families, and the community.

Officers attending said, all ten Year 9 forms took part enthusiastically, joining in class discussions, asking thoughtful 'What if?' questions, and were a real credit to the Academy.

Repeat shoplifter charged and remanded

A 42 year old woman from St Leonards On Sea has been remanded to court after pleading guilty this week to a string of shoplifting offences.

The offences took place at various of supermarkets in the Hastings and St Leonards area.

At Brighton and Hove Magistrates Court on the 28th May 2025, she pled guilty and was charged with 1 count of attempted shoplifting, and 2 counts of shoplifting, she was remanded in custody until the 4th June 2025.
