## **Personal Security**

There have been a few instances where young people have been causing issues within the area. This is unacceptable and will need all of us to help stop it. If you see a group of young people causing ASB, causing upset or speaking in manner which constitutes a public order offence then report to 999 or 101. This is the same for if there are any weapons or drugs that are seen.

## **Electric Bikes**

Riding an electric bike: the rules - GOV.UK - You can rider an eclectic bike if you're 14 or over, if it is an "electrically assisted pedal cycle. (EAPC)

# Your EAPC bike should be marked with the following:

The continuous rated power output

The bike manufacturer

#### It must also show either:

The battery's voltage

The maximum speed the motor can propel the bike

## Cannot ride it on the pavement.

Your bike is not an EAPC if the following apply:

It can be propelled at more than 15.5 miles per hour(mph) by the motor

Has a continuous rated power output higher than 250 watts

Does not have pedals that can propel it

If your bike is not an EAPC – it must be registered and taxed

#### You need to:

get a valid driving licence to ride one

Wear a motorcycle helmet that meets British safety standards

insure your vehicle

If your bike is classed as a motorcycle or moped but has not been insured, you may get a fine or your bike may be seized by the police.

## **Driving safely**

There has been an increase on the use of mobile phones being used whist operating a motor vehicle. This includes cars, vans, bikes and anything else that moves under its own power. It's dangerous as well as could land you 6 driving points on your license and £200 fine. I ask that you wait until you have pulled over to use your phone as it takes away your concentration and could lead to an accident.

There has been an increase of individuals riding pushbikes (and electric ones) on the pavement in central Hove. This is illegal and can lead to a £50 fine each time you do it. It is contrary to S.36 of the Road Traffic Act 1988.
