Lots of literature was handed out and lots of crime prevention advice given – please help us and ensure if you have any vulnerable friends or family that you share information with them and try to protect them from fraud.

There have been a few reports of youths smoking cannabis around London Road. A group has been seen around the back of Bourne Court causing a nuisance and making residents feel uncomfortable. We have increased patrols and have spoken to several young people when in the area.
