#### **Neighbourhood Policing Team**

November got off to a very damp start and the weather has not been kind to any of us. Despite the storms and inclement weather we have had a very busy few weeks and have seen various weeks of action taking place across the month.

#### **Op Sceptre**

Op Sceptre is a national campaign tackling knife crime through a period of intensified action including education, engagement, and enforcement work. Alongside our enforcement work across the week, our teams were out engaging with members of the local community, visiting the university, speaking with students, visiting schools, visiting taxi ranks, conducting knife sweeps, carrying out test purchasing, holding street briefings and visiting local retailers.

It was once again a hugely successful week (results will be published on our website in due course) and whilst the week of action has come to a close, I want to reassure you that our work in this area continues.

#### Op Calibre

Operation Calibre is a week-long national campaign to tackle personal robbery, which is a significant contributor to violent crime across the country.

Last year the operation saw 385 arrests made by forces, with 427 schools and 126 local community events talking about the dangers of personal robbery taking place.

During this week of action our teams have been out carrying out enforcement and prevention work including taking intelligence led action against robbery offenders, carrying out educational input and conducting hot spot patrolling.

#### **Adult Safeguarding Week**

We supported the Ann Craft Trust Safeguarding Adults week and shared important messaging throughout the week through our social media channels to help spread the messages far and wide.

The aim of the week was "to highlight key safeguarding issues, start conversations and raise awareness of safeguarding best practice".

Our Neighbourhood Policing Team focussed on fraud and were out speaking to adults about everything fraud and scam related. They had a full diary for the week and visited Jubilee Library, Marks & Spencer, King Alfred Leisure Centre, Barclays Bank and CAMEO Bishop Hannington Church to name just a few!! We hope that the information they shared was useful and if you are part of a

community group or business who feel you would benefit from some advice in this area, please get in touch and we can arrange a PCSO visit.

Our most recent Surrey & Sussex Police Fraud newsletter is attached to this bulletin for your information.

It is hard to believe that December is tomorrow and the Christmas countdown is starting. We always very much look forward to seeing the city light up and to seeing all the festive activities unfold across the month. I would just like to use this opportunity to remind everyone that we do often see an increase in theft and burglary at this time of year so just stay vigilant. Keep personal belongings safe if you are out shopping, stick to well-lit areas, lock doors and windows at home and be mindful if you are receiving deliveries and ensure they are not left where they may be vulnerable to theft. #### **Click-Call-Connect**



We simply cannot stress enough the importance of reporting but your decision about how to report can be the difference between saving a life or not. It is vital phone lines are kept clear for people who need to contact police during a genuine emergency and need assistance urgently.

Our Click Call Connect campaign is designed to help you decide how best to report a non-emergency.

All reports made online are assessed by one of our skilled Contact Officers – the very same people who you would normally speak to if you called 101. 101 does receive a high level of calls and so by reporting online you do not have to spend your time queuing to speak with us, it also leaves the lines clear for anyone who does not have access to the internet.


## Appeal for witnesses after Jewish Refugee memorial is damaged in Brighton

### **Op Sceptre**



Are you familiar with the law on carrying a knife?

In England, it is illegal to:

- Sell a knife to anyone under 18, unless it is a knife with a folding blade that is three inches long or less.
- Carry a knife in public without good reason, unless it is a knife with a folding blade that is three inches long or less.
- Carry, buy or sell any banned knife. Use any knife (even if it is a legal one) in a threatening way.

The police can stop and search anyone they suspect of carrying a knife.

The maximum penalty for carrying a knife is four years in prison and an unlimited fine.

If someone you are with uses a knife while you are with them, you could get the same sentence.

An automatic prison sentence is handed to anyone convicted twice of carrying a knife.

Please share this information with your family, children and friends to increase awareness around the consequences of carrying a knife – It's not worth it!

#### Beat The Burglar



Now the darker nights are well and truly drawing in, don't let the burglars win. Prevention is the best defence against burglary. A Keep ladders inside locked sheds and out of sight Don't advertise you're away on social media On't leave keys under plant pots or doormats Keep valuables away from windows.

#### **Night Time Economy**

We continue to be aware of reports of people having their mobile phones stolen when out on a night out.

A group of 2-3 men are approaching members of the public and offering to sell them Nitrous Oxide/NOS balloons. Once an exchange has taken place, they then offer to add their contact details into the victim's phone. When these males have the phone, they then run, leaving them with access to the unlocked phone including banking details.

Use of nitrous oxide can be dangerous and it is now a criminal offence to be in possession of this Class C drug.

We urge you to stay vigilant and think SMART!

- SECURITY Ensure your security features (PIN, tracking etc) are enabled on your phone
- MINDFUL Keep your phone on you at all times use a security strap, keep it in a zipped pocket and keep it out of sight in busy places
- AWARE Be aware of your surroundings and only use your phone when safe to do so
- **X** REFUSE Don't hand your phone over to strangers under any circumstances
- TRUST Trust your instincts, if something doesn't feel right, it probably isn't.
