

Brunswick and Adelaide PCSO Monthly Update

Hello everyone! This is your ward update for Brunswick and Adelaide, looking back at the month of July. and offering current crime prevention advice.

Within the month of July:

- Reports of ASB has decreased from 91 reports in June to 67 reports in July. The tent encampments have cleared from Brunswick Square which is positive.
- Burglary decreased from 4 reports in June to 2 reports in July.
- A decrease in criminal damage from 11 reports in June, to 5 reports in July.

Key Priorities:

- To continue the reduction of ASB in green spaces
- Waterloo Street gardens increase in patrols due to ongoing ASB concerns

Crime Prevention Advice

StreetSafe is a service that allows you to report safety concerns in public places without giving us your name (anonymously). This includes issues like poorly lit streets, abandoned buildings, or vandalism, as well as instances where you feel unsafe due to someone following or verbally abusing you. Examples of situations that should be reported to StreetSafe include a poorly lit alleyway that makes you feel unsafe or a park with broken equipment that poses a safety hazard.
