Cost of Living & Energy Support – How to Get Help

Winter Fuel & Energy Support

- Heating your home to at least 18°C is vital, particularly if you are over 65, have reduced mobility, or a long-term health condition.

- You may be eligible for Winter Fuel Payments, grants, or discounts through government schemes.

You may be eligible for additional support through:

- Local Discretionary Social Fund

- LEAP (Local Energy Advice Partnership) – offers free home visits, energy-saving kits, and confidential money and benefits advice
