Tackling ASB in your communities

Late last week, officers from your Eastbourne Policing Teams held a community meeting open to all residents in Shinewater.

The meeting, which was an opportunity for locals to not only speak to their Shinewater officers and report any recent incidents; but also a chance for residents to hear firsthand from the officers who patrol their streets on the work being conducted to tackle ASB in the area; including updates from recent patrols and local policing activities over the Summer months.



As a result of community concerns raised on the day a number of actions have been agreed by local officers, including continued additional patrols and further community meetings.

Officers also continue to work alongside partners and residents in the area to help create a safe atmosphere where everyone can enjoy the area without unwanted anti-social behaviour.

After the meeting officers also stopped by Shinewater Primary at school leaving time, to catch up with both parents and youngsters heading home from school, to hear of any issues parents and carers may be experiencing around the area.

Thank you to everyone who came along to our meeting, your reports and information is key in supporting officer patrols and the work being conducted in the area to keep everyone safe.

We thank residents for their time and reports, and continue to encourage anyone to report incidents of ASB to police at the time either by calling 101 or reporting online www.sussex.police.uk.

Two men have been charged with multiple offences, following excellent partnership work between Sussex Police and Kent Police.

Police were alerted to a report of a Toyota Hilux, on cloned plates, being driven through Horam, East Sussex, about 5.30pm on Tuesday 2 September.

The vehicle – confirmed stolen from Westham two days previously – was spotted a short time later and a pursuit ensued into Tunbridge Wells, Kent.

Command was led by the Kent Police Force Incident Manager, and officers from the Sussex Police Roads Policing Unit and Specialist Enforcement Unit used tactics to attempt to stop the Toyota.

The vehicle was abandoned in Montacute Gardens, Tunbridge Wells, and the driver decamped, but was tracked by a Sussex Police Dog Unit and found hiding in a toilet cubicle of the nearby Sainsbury's store.



Detective Chief Inspector Cath O'Connor said: "This incident demonstrates how officers from neighbouring forces work together, often in fast-paced and dynamic situations, to keep the public safe from harm.

"I'd like to commend all staff and officers involved for bringing the pursuit to a safe and successful conclusion.

"While considerable damage was caused to a number of police vehicles and parked vehicles, thankfully no serious injuries were reported."

A 27yo male, of no fixed address, was arrested and charged with aggravated vehicle taking, failing to stop when required by police, driving without valid insurance and driving without a valid licence.


He has been remanded in custody and is due to appear at Brighton Magistrates' Court for trial on 10 October.

A second male, a 21yo, of Seaside Road, Eastbourne, was arrested and charged with possession of cannabis, two counts of driving while disqualified, failing to provide a specimen for analysis, two counts of theft of a motor vehicle, two counts of burglary and two counts of driving without valid insurance.

He pleaded guilty to all offences at Brighton Magistrates' Court on Friday 5 September and has been remanded in custody for sentencing on 3 October (further details can be found here:

They covered a number of locations including Hampden Park Skate Park, Gildredge Park and the Sovereign Centre skate park, as part of our ongoing commitment to serious violence reduction.

From their searches as well as finding evidence of drugs, Cadets and their Leaders spoke with over 60 youngsters and parents in the parks around the work being conducted to keep them safe.

Many positive interactions had, with Cadets speaking to teens their age around the dangers and consequences of both drug use and becoming involved in crime.

Man sentenced following serious assault



A man has been sentenced after a violent assault in Eastbourne.

A 29 year old man, of The Sidings, Polegate, was found guilty at court this week of possessing an offensive weapon.

Police were called on the evening of 27 April 2024 to reports of an assault involving a weapon on Terminus Road, Eastbourne.

At the scene, officers found a golf club; and following enquiries, including reviewing CCTV and mobile phone footage, a man was identified and arrested; at custody he was further arrested for possession of class A drugs.

The victim was taken to hospital the same evening, where he was treated for his injuries, and was later discharged.

At Lewes Crown Court on the 4 September, he pleaded guilty to the offence of possession of an offensive weapon, and possession of a controlled substance.

He was sentenced to 20 months' imprisonment, suspended for 24 months, along with 80 hours of unpaid work and ordered to pay a £187 fine.
